

CDR Christopher "Chris" Hutton is a Military Professor at the Naval War College's Stockton Center for International Law in Newport, RI. A native of Chico, California, he earned a B.A. in History from Gonzaga University (2003, cum laude), a J.D. from the University of Southern California Gould School of Law (2009), and an LL.M. in National Security Law from Georgetown University (2020, honors). He also holds a master's in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College (2025). He is a member of the California and U.S. Supreme Court bars. Commissioned in 2009, he completed Officer Development School and Naval Justice School shortly thereafter.

CDR Hutton has advised more than a dozen operational flag officers across a diverse range of joint and maritime assignments.
